IN THE POST-PANDEMIC WORKPLACE, ASYNCHRONOUS COMMUNICATION IS KEY

B efore the pandemic, organizations traditionally operated on a synchronous communication model.

"The conventional, physical office made it easy for employees to work on things together, at the same time. The same cannot be said for the remote-first model of today's world. Working from home has made coordination and communication within the organization a struggle. No longer is it possible to drop by a colleague's desk to ask a question or work through a problem," says Bryan Giger, CEO and co-founder of Dashlabs.ai and Philippine-Swiss Business Council (PSBC) Life Sciences & Digital Health Innovation Cluster Head.

Indeed, COVID-19 changed the way we work and communicate. Fortunately, many organizations managed to use the pandemic as an opportunity for change to address the challenges of a post-pandemic workplace.

"One such organization is GitLab, a fully-remote company that uses an asynchronous communication model to coordinate and move work forward across time zones," Bryan says.

He cites a blog post by Preston Wickersham who describes asynchronous work as a simple concept: "Do as much as you can with what you have, document everything, transfer ownership of the project to the next person, then start working on something else."

Aside from allowing people to accomplish work without relying on others being online or present, an asynchronous workflow also gives each employee greater autonomy and ownership over their work, explains Bryan.

He highly recommends reading more about asynchronous communication in <u>GitLab's</u> online employee handbook.

Like GitLab, Dashlabs.ai also uses several asynchronous digital tools. Slack, the company's default chat and communication tool, allows their team to communicate with each other but does not require an immediate response – people respond when they can. Notion is their default documentation tool while GDrive serves as the company's file repository. Meetings are held via Google Meet.

"These asynchronous tools have significantly improved our workflows," Bryan says. "Our people do their work, write the documentation on Notion, send a message on Slack with the Notion link, and move on to their next task."

APM TECHNICA PHILIPPINES: SYNERGY OF FILIPINO-SWISS CULTURES

eadquartered in Heerbrugg, Switzerland, APM Technica AG is a full-service adhesive and surface technology provider founded in October 2002 through a management buyout from Leica Geosystem AG. In March 2006, APM Technica Philippines was opened to give the Swiss company a local presence in the Asian market.

Like many businesses in the manufacturing sector, APM Technica Philippines was hit hard by the pandemic. But APM Technica AG's local branch adapted and has managed to survive despite tough challenges.

"To serve our customers as best as possible, some of our employees worked, ate and slept at our manufacturing facility at the beginning of the pandemic. We tweaked our IT infrastructure to enable our administrative employees to work from home," says Mr. Marcel Thenu, General Manager of APM Technica Philippines and Philippine-Swiss Business Council (PSBC) Board Member.

Located in Light Industry & Science Park 1 in Cabuyao City, Laguna, APM Technica Philippines provides quality adhesive products from its existing portfolio and manufactures custom products for clients. It also supplies industrial deep freezers for storage, dispensing and curing equipment; surface modification equipment to maximize adhesion. It likewise provides custom downloading and repackaging services for the manufacturing, aerospace, optical, medical, automotive, semiconductor, and electronic industries.

Mr. Thenu shared that through the Stagiaire Program of the Philippine-Swiss Agreement on Exchange of Professional and Technical Trainees, Filipino chemical engineers of APM Technica Philippines spent a year in the company's Switzerland headquarters. There they learned the adhesives manufacturing process, the Swiss way of doing business, and the Swiss culture. "When they returned to the Philippines, the engineers used what they learned to help support our operations and serve our customers. Their contributions enable us to grow in this competitive market."

PSBC, SWITZERLAND GLOBAL ENTERPRISE SIGN COOPERATION AGREEMENT ON TRADE PROMOTION

he Philippine-Swiss Business Council (PSBC) and Switzerland Global Enterprise (S-GE) signed a cooperation agreement in the field of trade promotion between the Philippines and Swiss and Liechtenstein companies. Under the cooperation agreement, PSBC will provide Swiss and Liechtenstein companies with

free basic services, including basic information and free initial consultation, in close coordination with the Embassy of Switzerland in the Philippines. In addition, PSBC may execute individual projects and mandates for Swiss and Liechtenstein companies commissioned by S-GE.





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
